Nursing school students don't need to struggle to learn proper practices anymore.

Nursing school is different from non-nursing school because teachers review theories and students must apply what they learn into hands-on practice. Previously at Sekolah Tinggi Ilmu Keperawatan (STIK) Ms. Martha Wiratanti would first teach students how to care for a hand injury then do a live demo while the students crowded around her. After using an AVerVision visualizer, Martha was able to clearly and easily show all of her students how to care for a hand injury on a large projection screen. As a result, her students sat in their chairs and jotted important notes down. Martha was also more focused and class was safer since everyone wasn't crowded around sharp surgical tools.

Speaking of the surgical tools, some of them are quite small. In regard to caring for a hand injury, certain needles, thread, and knots are used. If none of them are used correctly, a wound would not properly heal. Therefore, Martha was able to zoom in on hard to see but crucial procedures with the visualizer for all her students to see. Additionally, the procedures were recorded so that students could review the material at any time.


